

Deployment Case Study Indiana School District

1,500 Desktops in 3 Days

A large school district in Indiana found themselves with a problem. It was December, their student desktops had become out of date, and they didn't want to wait until the end of the school year to replace them. The catch: they wanted to conduct the refresh without any disruption to the activities of the students and faculty. This left them with an extremely short window of time – the entire installation would have to be completed in a compressed timeframe during winter break.
